To be considered for the Dr. Arthur C. Moeller scholarship, the Active Brother must reside in the Chapter House. 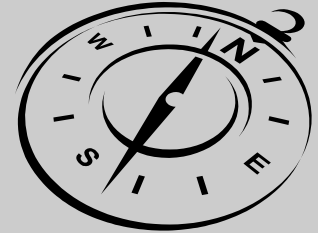
MISSING BROTHERS

TOUGH TIMES AT THE HOUSE

The biggest challenge of the past year was to manage the active chapter rent subsidy. Because of low active chapter membership, the house was under populated. This under population made living in the house extremely expensive for the active chapter and many actives could not afford to live in the house. Therefore, to make living in the house a viable proposition, KSR decided to subsidize rent for the period between August 2001 and July 2002. KSR agreed that all actives living in the house should pay \$275 a month plus utilities and KSR made up the difference between the active chapter's payment and the rent required by Marquette. The subsidy was



not the only thing done to make the house affordable. The active chapter took on non-Triangle boarders, stepped up recruitment, and we have been working with Marquette to negotiate a more practical house lease, one that is pro-rated based on the number of people living in the house, not a flat rate for the property. It was through these efforts that we were able to discontinue the subsidy after rent again became affordable.
